PRACTICE TOOL 3

CHILDREN ARE INFORMED ABOUT THEIR RIGHTS

Child Safe Organisation National Principle 2: Children and young people are informed about their rights, participate in decisions that affect them and are taken seriously.

Children and young people who have experienced family and domestic violence may not have the confidence to voice their opinions when they feel there has been a lack of justice or they have been mistreated. Children and young people need to know how to get help when they feel at risk. They also need to understand how rights apply to them in their lives. Educating children and young people about their rights helps them to recognise relationships that make them feel unhappy, unsafe, or uncomfortable, how to report concerns or abuse and where to get help.

Consider the questions on the next page and prioritise the ones you think will help children, young people, yourself and other staff the most.





QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER

How as an organisation do we demonstrate our commitment to supporting children and young people to understand their rights?

Do we allocate time to talk with children and young people about their rights and how to make a complaint? Is this information available in their welcome packs?

When and how do we evaluate the effectiveness of the rights education we provide to children and young people?

Do we have a childfriendly Child Safe Code of Conduct?

How do we discuss the roles and responsibilities of children and young people in helping to ensure the safety and wellbeing of their peers?

How do we make sure that children and young people know how to make a complaint and voice their concerns?

Do we have ways of talking about rights that are appropriate for different age groups or cultures?




UN right of the Child -Teen version


